Sports Premium

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will see money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The purpose of the funding is that school will have to spend the sports funding in improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Allocation

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils as at the census in January 2013.

All schools with 17 or more primary aged children will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

Funding period

The funding will be allocated over three academic years 2013/14 2014/15 and 2015/16

Accountability

Schools will be held to account for how they spend the sport funding. Ofsted has strengthened its coverage of sport and PE within the inspector's handbook and supporting guidance, so that schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision offered.

Academic Year 2014/15

We received a grant of £8,900 for the year 2015/16. This money was used in a number of different ways to support the provision of improved quality of sports and PE for all pupils.
