

Year 3 Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Maney Hill Primary! ☺

The children have had a great start to life in Year 3 and are enjoying the extra responsibility and benefits they earn as juniors.

Here is a brief outline of the units we have planned for this term:

Subject	Focus
English	We will begin this year in English studying Roald Dahl. The children will use some of Dahl's stories and rhymes, namely <i>The Enormous Crocodile</i> , <i>James and the Giant Peach</i> , <i>George's Marvellous Medicine</i> , <i>The Twits</i> , <i>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</i> and <i>Revolting Rhymes</i> . We will research and present information about Roald Dahl using non-fiction texts and also focus on creative writing and expressive speech this term. Furthermore, there will be opportunities to discuss Dahl's rich characters and plots, and also chances for children to present their own variations.
Maths	The children will begin this term looking at place value, ordering numbers and estimating. They will develop their addition and subtraction technique as well as multiplication and division, with opportunities to develop mastery of these skills in problem solving activities. Other areas covered this term include geometry, measurement, statistics, fractions and time. These areas will be revisited throughout the year to ensure children leave Year 3 with a depth to their subject knowledge across all areas of the Maths curriculum.
Science	In Science we will begin by learning about rocks and soil. The children will investigate the permeability, hardness and floatability of a range of rocks as well as differentiating between sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rock. They will explore the variety of minerals that we consume in food, investigate similarities and differences in soils and create their own fossils!
Topic	'Ancient Egypt' will be our topic for the Autumn Term. The children will build their world geography by researching different continents of the world, including differences in climates, before comparing Egypt with the UK. They will also investigate the Egyptian period using a timeline, research Egyptian Gods and Goddesses and write using hieroglyphics. Additionally, children will design, create, decorate and evaluate their own Egyptian burial mask.
P.E.	In P.E. this term the children will develop their skills in basketball and multi-skills as well as improving proficiency and confidence in dance and gymnastics.

Children will also have regular R.E, Music and French lessons.

Homework, Spellings and Reading

- One piece of homework will be handed out each Friday, to be returned no later than the following Wednesday. Homework will alternate between English and Maths although a piece of Science or Topic may occasionally be sent out instead.
- The children will also get spellings to learn on a weekly basis. Spellings will be handed out on Friday, in spelling books, to be learnt at home for a test the following Friday. As a way of learning spellings, I would recommend getting your child to use them within written sentences which can be written in Homework books. Not only does this help with spelling the words, but also puts the words into context, builds your child's vocabulary and develops their sentence structure.
- Each child should be reading frequently at home and children will have the opportunity to change their reading book every day although should establish a deep understanding of the text before changing books.
